English *First paper*

7. Writing paragraph by answering questions (10 marks)

Note for students

- (1) Students must give the paragraph the same heading as given in the question paper, omitting the inverted comma. Instead, they should underline it. If no heading occurs in the question paper, they have to give a heading on their own and also underline it. (2) The opening sentence of the paragraph is called topic sentence. It is the most important sentence of the paragraph. It must be the relevant answer to the question no.(a). Students should guard against misspelling any word of this sentence.
- (3) Other sentences should follow the order of the questions. If sentences are disorderly, marks will be reduced.

- (4) the length of the paragraph should be confined to the prescribed word limit (here 200 words). It may be fairly shorter, consisting of 160 to 170 words. But it must not exceed the word limit.
- (5) The paragraph must be written in a **single Para**. Dividing the paragraph into more than one Para is prohibited.

7. Write a paragraph on "Begging" in about 200 words based on the answers to the following questions.

(a) What is begging? (b)why is it taken to? (c)What is your impression about a beggar? (d)What is his appearance? (e)What is the responsibility of society for a beggar?

Begging

Begging is a means of staying alive parasitically. It is usually resorted to as a desperate alternative. However, there are some fake beggars. they thrive on the misplaced charity of others. But they are a rare exception. Because every person has the urge to stand on his dignity as a self-reliant individual. Even a present beggar might be a wage-earner in the near past. But some sudden mishap condemned him to a grim life. Shorn of his ability to work and nowhere to go, he begs for alms. He has a depressed appearance. It provokes the image of a person defeated to life. His tattered clothes make him a standing exhibition of decrepitude. But the circumstances that account for his misery

also hold the society accountable. It is a disgrace to a society that takes his plight for granted. The state or social organizations should arrange for monthly allowance for all genuine beggars to keep clear of a social shame.
